Wrens Open Sessions

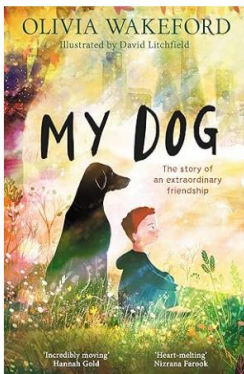


We would like to say a big thankyou to all the parents and carers of Wrens' children that joined us for the workshops we offered.
